monthly food collection will be donated to the community IFeed project. Seven area high school Interact Clubs - Aquinas, Central, Holmen, Logan, Onalaska, West Salem, and Caledonia - have joined forces to create iFeed. iFeed is now in its seventh year of raising funds and food for local pantries.

Since the first iFeed in 2015, the Interact Clubs collected approximately 30,000 food items each year! That's almost 13 tons of food for our local pantries. This year we are helping with the collection of much-needed non-perishable food items for our local food pantries. Aquinas High School students will pick up our collected items. In addition,
